RE: Recommended changes to Model Ordinance

Here are some recommended changes to the revised draft of the Model Ordinance:

Section 1.01 -- Following "Wyoming Statutes." add ",1957, Cum. Supp. 1974, and hereinafter referred to as "the Act."

Section 1.03 - Add a comma after "runoff" in line 10. -- strike the comma following "district" in line 21.
-- strike the word "to" in line 23.
-- strike the phrase "maintain the tax base" in line 25.

Section 1.09 -- Section should be re-done as follows:

"If any section, provision or portion of this Ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall be limited to the section, provision or portion expressly found invalid and shall not affect or invalidate the remaining sections of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect."

Also, Don, Section 1 should be re-numbered so the subsections are listed consecutively.

Section 2.01 -- following "Wyoming Statutes", strike "as amended" and add "1957, Cum. Supp. 1974."

Section 2.02 -- strike "are the" after the title and insert "means."


Section 2.03 -- strike "is" after the title and insert "means".
